RENTAL INFORMATION

Explore the possibilities of hosting your events at some of Wyomissing's most delightful facilities. The Stone House, and Pavilions at Happy Hollow and Wyomissing Hills Playgrounds are available for rent to all Borough residents, providing ideal settings for parties, meetings, or reunions. Additionally, the Wyomissing Pool and Pool Pavilion are open for private rentals for additional summer fun.

To reserve your desired date and facility, a refundable \$100.00 deposit is required, and reservations should be made at least two weeks in advance. Check WyomissingREC.com for availability and to make your reservation on a first-come, first-served basis. Please note that alcoholic beverages, illegal substances, and glass containers are strictly prohibited at any recreational facility.

FACILITY FAQs



Q: How do I go about renting one of the Borough's facilities?

A: Visit WyomissingREC.com and click on the RESERVE icon on the navigation bar, then follow the prompts to initiate the rental process.

Q: Is facility rental limited to Wyomissing Borough residents only?

A: Yes, facility rental is exclusive to Wyomissing Borough residents.

Q: How long is the facility available for rental?

A: When rented, the facility is reserved for the entire day. Setup the day before is not permitted. Clean-up is the responsibility of the renter at the end of the event to ensure readiness for the next reservation.

Q: When and where do I pick up the keys, and when should I return the keys?

A: For weekday events, pick up the key the day before the scheduled event. For weekend events, pick up the Friday (unless it's a holiday). Keys can be picked up at the receptionist desk at Borough Hall (22 Reading Blvd. Wyomissing) between the hours of 9:30 AM and 2:30 PM. Keys must be placed in the black dropbox at the facility upon completion of rental.

Q: Are grills provided at the locations?

A: No, grills are not provided. You may bring your own gas grill, but it must be attended to at all times and removed from the facility after use. Please ensure a safe distance from the facility during operation.

Q: Can I bring tents or inflatables?

A: No, for liability reasons, tents and inflatables are not permitted.

Q: What is required upon leaving the facility?

A: Dispose of trash in designated receptacles, thoroughly clean the facility, and ensure proper closure, including locking bathrooms and the facility itself. Our staff will conduct a walk through to ensure all policies and rules were followed and that the facility is left in good, clean condition.



STARGAZING IN THE PARKLANDS

Experience the quiet magic of the night sky with Stargazing in the Parklands, one of Wyomissing's most peaceful and awe-inspiring seasonal events. The Parklands' wide-open meadows and naturally dark skies create the perfect setting to step away from the glow of everyday life and look upward into a world far beyond our own.

Whether you're spotting familiar constellations, catching a glimpse of a distant planet, or simply taking in the sweep of the Milky Way, stargazing offers a rare chance to slow down and appreciate the beauty above us. It's relaxing, accessible to all ages, and a wonderful way to reconnect with nature.

This year, we once again welcome our friends from the Berks County Amateur Astronomical Society, who will guide the experience with high-powered telescopes, expert insights, and plenty of enthusiasm to help you discover what's shining overhead. 

HOW TO REGISTER

The Wyomissing Summer Playground Program is open exclusively to Wyomissing Borough residents. All children must be registered, and the program fee must be paid before participation. Guests and visitors are not permitted during program hours, and playground facilities are closed to non-program use.

To register, visit **WyomissingREC.com**, sign in or create an account, navigate to the PROGRAMS page, and select your child's activity. Choose PAY ONLINE to secure a spot immediately or be placed on a wait list if the program is full.

To ensure a safe and successful experience, parents are asked to read the Parent Handbook and any other materials or electronic communications provided before the program begins. Families are encouraged to review the rules, guidelines, and expectations with their children so they are prepared for a fun and positive summer.

Program Age Requirements:

- Tot Lot: Ages 5–6; must have completed kindergarten prior to the start of the program (no exceptions, per Pennsylvania state law).
- Playground Program: Ages 7 through 12; must be 7 years old by September 1st to enroll.

Providing accurate information ensures each child is placed in the appropriate program and helps maintain a safe, organized, and enjoyable environment for everyone.

REGISTRATION DATES

Enrollment Begins: January 15

We are not setting a registration deadline or closing date, but registration is mandatory through the **WyomissingREC.com** platform. Early registration helps the Borough plan staffing levels, organize program supplies, and ensure a smooth and successful summer experience for all participants. For the safety of your children and our staff, no registrations will be accepted at the playgrounds.

Tot Lot (ages 5 to 6): **\$175** per child

Morning Playground (ages 7 through 12): **\$175** per child

Evening Playground (ages 7 through 12): **\$95** per child

The Tot Lot is designed for children ages 5 to 6 who have completed kindergarten prior to the start of the program. The Playground Program is open to children ages 7 through 12, and participants must be 7 years old by September 1st to enroll.

These age requirements are mandatory, and there are no exceptions, as we are required to follow Pennsylvania state guidelines. Please note that this is a playground program run by the Borough of Wyomissing's Department of Recreation, not a licensed daycare provider regulated by the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services. Our focus is on providing a fun, supervised environment where children can play, explore, and build friendships throughout the summer.



THE PARKLANDS OF WYOMISSING BOROUGH



Wyomissing has a rich history, once inhabited by Native Americans from the Lenni Lenape tribe along the banks of Wyomissing Creek.


The name "Wyomissing" is believed to mean "a place of flats," capturing the area's flat terrain. Unique to the Borough is the strategic preservation of open spaces within residential areas. In 1929, founder Ferdinand Thun secured and preserved land along both sides of the creek, later designated as parkland in the 1970s.

The extensive trail network, composed of paved, stone, and grass paths, offers both short and long excursions, allowing residents to traverse the Borough from the Reading Museum to The Highlands. The trails follow the picturesque Wyomissing Creek, leading to meadows, piney woods, and landmarks like Old Man Echo.

Throughout the year, diverse plant life, including snowdrops, skunk cabbage, wildflowers, and blossoms, adorns the landscape, complemented by lush meadows and forests. The parklands are a haven for wildlife, hosting deer, eagles, brown trout, painted turtles, and various freshwater invertebrates in the Wyomissing Creek.

In the words of 16th-century physician Paracelsus, "The art of healing comes from nature, not from the physician." Wyomissing Parklands provide a natural connection proven to alleviate stress, strengthen relationships, and enhance mental well-being.

DID YOU KNOW?

For generations, summer in Wyomissing has meant one thing above all else — time spent at the pool. Long before today's aquatics programs, swim lessons, and community events, swimming was already woven into the fabric of Borough life, shaping childhoods, friendships, and summer traditions that many residents still remember fondly.

Wyomissing's earliest swimming memories center around Happy Hollow, where a community pool became the heartbeat of warm-weather recreation. In 1926, land donated by Henry Janssen and Ferdinand Thun — two influential figures in Wyomissing's early development — was transformed into what would become the Borough's first major swimming pool. At the time, it was an impressive and forward-thinking facility, holding nearly 300,000 gallons of water and stretching approximately 150 feet in length. The pool was supplied by a cold artesian well owned by Textile Machine Works, giving swimmers a brisk, refreshing plunge that many later recalled with a mix of shock and affection.

From its earliest days, the Happy Hollow Swimming Pool was more than a place to cool off. It quickly became a social center — a destination where families gathered, friendships formed, and summers unfolded. The pool hosted high school swimming and diving competitions, drawing crowds eager to cheer from the sidelines, and elaborate water pageants, featuring synchronized swimming, diving exhibitions, and aquatic performances that reflected the era's sense of celebration and community pride.



DID YOU KNOW?



For children growing up in the 1930s, 40s, and 50s, a day at the pool was often the highlight of summer. There were designated swim hours, diving boards that felt impossibly high, and long afternoons spent racing friends from one end of the pool to the other. Parents watched from the deck, neighbors caught up on the latest news, and friendships were formed that would last long after the pool gates closed for the season. In an era before backyard pools and air conditioning, Happy Hollow was a shared refuge — a place where nearly everyone in the Borough passed through at some point.

As Wyomissing continued to grow, so did the community's need for modern recreational facilities. By 1960, the original Happy Hollow pool had reached the end of its lifespan and was replaced by a new municipal swimming pool at 901 Evans Avenue — the pool many residents know today. Although the original pool was eventually removed and the land repurposed, the tradition it established never faded. Instead, it carried forward into a new chapter of aquatic recreation.

Today's Wyomissing Pool reflects that evolution. While the setting has changed, the purpose remains the same: bringing people together. Swim lessons introduce children to the water with confidence and care, teens gather with friends on summer afternoons, and adults find both relaxation and fitness through open swim and aqua programs. Each splash, laugh, and milestone echoes the same spirit that defined Happy Hollow decades ago.

The story of swimming in Wyomissing is ultimately a story about community. It's about a Borough that understood early on the value of shared spaces, summer traditions, and recreation that welcomes everyone. From cold artesian water and diving exhibitions to modern aquatics programming, swimming has always been more than an activity here — it has been a place where memories are made.

As another summer approaches and the pool gates open once again, residents are not just stepping into the water — they're stepping into a legacy nearly a century in the making.
